### Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the City of Middletown Industrial Development Agency (the "Agency"), a component unit of the City of Middletown, New York, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2019 and 2018, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Agency's basic financial statements as listed in the Table of Contents.

### Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial statements based on our audits. We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audits to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used, and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

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## **Opinion**

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the City of Middletown Industrial Development Agency, a component unit of the City of Middletown, New York, as of December 31, 2019 and 2018, and the respective changes in financial position, and cash flows thereof for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

## **Other Matters**

### *Required Supplementary Information*

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis, on pages 3-4, be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audits of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

### *Other Information*

Our audits were conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements that collectively comprise the City of Middletown Industrial Development Agency, a component unit of the City of Middletown, New York's basic financial statements. The Schedule of Indebtedness and Schedule of Supplementary Information are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements.

The Schedule of Indebtedness and Schedule of Supplementary Information are the responsibility of management and were derived from and relate directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. Such information, except for the number of current full time employees, information upon which we express no opinion, has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

## **Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards**

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued our report dated March 17, 2020, on our consideration of the City of Middletown Industrial Development Agency, a component unit of the City of Middletown, New York's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. **FINANCIAL OPERATIONS HIGHLIGHTS**

There was an increase in net position in 2019 of \$11,741, and a decrease in net position in 2018 of \$(191), resulting in an overall positive change of \$11,932. This change is primarily due to an increase in administrative fees received. The increase was due to a new project starting in 2019.

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**I. ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**A. Organization and Purpose**

The City of Middletown Industrial Development Agency ("Agency") was created in 1982 by the New York State Legislature under the provisions of Chapter 632 of the Laws of New York State. The Agency was established for the purpose of encouraging economic growth in the City of Middletown, New York ("City"). The Agency assists with financing arrangements, and has the authority to grant real property, mortgage and sales tax exemptions. The Agency is exempt from Federal, State and Local income taxes.

The Agency is comprised of five board members, a chairman, vice chairman, secretary, treasurer and executive director.

**B. The Reporting Entity**

The Agency is considered a component unit of the financial reporting entity known as the City of Middletown, New York. Inclusion in the financial reporting entity, the City of Middletown, is determined based on financial accountability as defined by GASB Statement No. 14, "The Financial Reporting Entity", as amended. Members of the governing board of the Agency are appointed by the Common Council of the City. This level of control meets the criteria for financial accountability as defined by GASB Statement No. 14, as amended.

**C. Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Agency have been prepared in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP), as applied to government units. The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) is the accepted standard-setting body for establishing governmental accounting and financial reporting principles. Under standards set by GASB, the Agency is considered a proprietary fund. Proprietary fund financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, which records the financial effects of transactions and other events when these transactions and events occur. Revenues are recognized when they are earned and expenses are recognized when they are incurred. The measurement focus is the flow of economic resources.

**D. Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and equivalents consist of funds deposited in demand deposit accounts, time deposit accounts and certificates of deposit with original maturities of less than three months.

For the purpose of presenting the Statements of Cash Flows, the Agency considers all demand deposits, time and savings accounts, and certificates of deposit with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash or cash equivalents.

The Agency's investment policies are governed by State statutes. The Agency has adopted its own written investment policy which provides for the deposit of funds in Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC") insured commercial banks or trust companies located within the State. The Agency is authorized to use demand deposit accounts, time deposit accounts and certificates of deposit. Permissible investments include obligations of the U.S. Treasury, U.S. Agencies, repurchase agreements and obligations of New York State or its political subdivisions.

Collateral is required for demand deposit accounts, time deposit accounts and certificates of deposit at 100% of all deposits not covered by the FDIC. These agreements authorize the obligations that may be pledged as collateral. Such obligations include, among other instruments, obligations of the United States and its agencies and obligations of the State and its municipal and school district subdivisions.

**D. Cash and Cash Equivalents (Continued)**

Custodial credit risk is the risk that in the event of a bank failure, the Agency's deposits may not be returned to it. Deposits are required to be disclosed as exposed to custodial credit risk if they are not covered by depository insurance and the deposits are either uncollateralized, collateralized by securities held by the pledging financial institution or collateralized by securities held by the pledging financial institution's trust department but not in the Agency's name. The Agency's aggregate bank balances were fully insured by the FDIC.

**E. Use of Estimates**

The preparation of basic financial statements, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

**F. Subsequent Events**

The Agency evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and/or recognition in the financial statements from December 31, 2019, and through March 17, 2020, the date on which the financial statements were approved for issuance.

**II. CONDUIT DEBT - INDUSTRIAL REVENUE BOND AND NOTE TRANSACTIONS**

Certain industrial development revenue bonds and notes are secured by property which is leased to companies and the bonds are retired by lease payments. The bonds and notes are not obligations of the Agency, City or the State of New York, but are considered conduit debt. The Agency does not record the assets or liabilities resulting from completed bond and note issues in its accounts since its primary function is to arrange the financing between the borrowing companies and the bond and note holders, and funds arising therefrom are controlled by trustees or banks acting as fiscal agents. For providing this service, the Agency receives bond administration fees from the borrowing companies. The fee received by the Agency is one-half of one percent on the first \$10 million of loans and one-eighth of one percent for any amount of borrowing in excess of \$10 million. Such administrative fee income is recognized immediately upon the issuance of bonds and/or notes. The Agency has no conduit debt outstanding as of December 31, 2019.

**III. NEW REPORTING STANDARDS**

In May 2019, GASB issued Statement 91, *Conduit Debt Obligations*. Under this statement, the GASB improved the existing standards related to conduit debt obligation disclosure by providing a single reporting method for government issuers. Although implementation is not required until the year ended December 31, 2021, the Corporation has implemented this standard early for the year ended December 31, 2019. There has been no effect on net position as a result of this implementation.

GASB has also issued Statements 87, 89, 90 and 92, none of which are expected to have any substantive effects on the Agency's net position.

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**IV. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

Subsequent to December 31, 2019, local, U.S., and world governments have encouraged self-isolation to curtail the spread of the global pandemic, coronavirus disease (COVID-19), by mandating temporary work stoppage in many sectors and imposing limitations on travel and size and duration of group meetings. Most industries are experiencing disruption to business operations and the impact of reduced consumer spending. There is unprecedented uncertainty surrounding the duration of the pandemic, its potential economic ramifications, and any government actions to mitigate them. Accordingly, while management cannot quantify the financial and other impact to the Agency as of March 17, 2020, management believes that a material impact on the Agency's financial position and results of future operations is reasonably possible.

**V. RECLASSIFICATIONS**

Certain items for the year ended December 31, 2018 have been reclassified to conform with the presentation for the year ended December 31, 2019. There is no effect on the 2018 results from operations.

We have audited, in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of the City of Middletown Industrial Development Agency (“Agency”), a component unit of the City of Middletown, New York, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2019 and 2018, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Agency’s basic financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated March 17, 2020.

**Internal Control Over Financial Reporting**

In planning and performing our audits of the financial statements, we considered the Agency’s internal control over financial reporting (internal control) to determine the audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Agency’s internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Agency’s internal control.

A *deficiency in internal control* exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A *material weakness* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity’s financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A *significant deficiency* is deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control, that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audits we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

## **Compliance and Other Matters**

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Agency's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

## **Purpose of this Report**

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the Agency's internal control or on compliance.
